The real story of a photographer trapped in a situation of common violence, in which he doesn't know whether he is victim, witness or accomplice.

A hot-blooded plot, attempting to capture one moment in a man's – or every Brazilian's – life.





Synopsis

At the end of an assignment, Henrique is mugged by two armed motorbikers who steal his camera and speed off. Five seconds later, he watches both get hit by a pickup truck driven by a self appointed avenger, someone weary of feeling defenseless against the urban violence, and who decided to take action.

Henrique recovers his stolen equipment and leaves, feeling avenged. But he goes back to find the memory card, with the photos, lost during the crash. From that moment, he is trapped in a situation where he is now the criminal for failing to rescue a victim, who had been his aggressor.

This will take him from the crime scene to the police station, and then to the emergency ward of the public hospital, in an attempt to clear himself.

Intentions

Victim or accomplice?

How do human interactions endure and evolve when confronted with high levels of urban violence and social barbarism?

How do fathers, mothers and sons, wives and husbands, boyfriends and girlfriends, or gay partners deal with them and reveal them into their routine life?

These are the main questions I am trying to confront, and that's what feeds my desire of cutting into the night time of someone like Henrique, a gifted photographer born and living in Rio de Janeiro.

- Lived in France for 15 years where she wrote and directed 5 short films. "Les Enfants de Charbon" was awarded with "Aides au Court-Métrage" and "Prime à la Qualité"; "Imago" represented Kodak at "Chefops" night. Directed institutional videos for UNESCO and SOS Racisme. Worked as personal assistant, script and casting director for directors Manuel Poirier, Blanca Li, Philippe Decouflé and Luc Besson. Received an Award for "Dreams of Party", adaptation of Julio Cortazar, and subsidies from CNC and French Regional Councils. In 2004, negotiated an option of her first feature film script, THE INVASION OF THE PLASTIC BAGS, in LA.
